Enhance and Increase Participation in ICCTA

- Act on Survey results by affirming the majority opinions regarding vision, mission, education, location of meetings, lobbying/legislating and participating in meetings by internet through interactive conferencing.
- Ensure ICCTA committee chairs understand and can convey the role of the committee to members through correspondence and electronic communication, and that the chair and members have up-to-date job descriptions.
- Ensure adequate Trustee orientation that describes the organization and its unique services, and how the ICCTA contributes to this mission. Consider Regional Chairs as presenters.
- Set a standard for the best participation ratio for ICCTA
- Have ground rules that support participation and attendance. Revisit the ground rules every other meeting or so, and post them on the bottom of agendas.
- Consider the number of ICCTA committees and committee members.
- Conduct yearly ICCTA committee evaluations that include a clear evaluation process where each committee member evaluates one another to consider how they can improve their contributions.
- Attempt to provide individual assignments to the ICCTA committee members.
- Consider having an ICCTA staff member participate in committee to help with administrative support and providing information where it would be useful.
- Monitor quorum requirements for ICCTA representative meetings.
- Consider having low-attendance members of ICCTA involved in some other form of service to the organization, e.g., holding and attending regional meetings.
- Act on annual reports and data
- Ramp up participation and generate interest in redesigning ICCTA logo
