What is Adult Education?

- 16 years and older, not enrolled or required to be enrolled in secondary school, and to provide instructional and support services that are designed to:
- Assist adults to become literate,
- Assist adults in completion of their secondary school education, and
- Assist adults in learning the English Language.

Adult Education Programs

- 90 programs throughout the state
 - CBO's
 - Community Colleges
 - School Districts/Regional Offices of Education
 - IDOC

Services Offered

- Adult Basic Education (ABE)
 - Functioning below a 9.0 GLE

- Adult Secondary Education (ASE)
 - Functioning above 9.0 GLE

 English as a Second Language(ESL) (Six levels)

- Vocational Training
- High School Credit
- Bridge Programs
- Integrated Models

Adult Education Funding

- Federal Funding \$ 18 million
 - Federal Basic
 - Federal EL/Civics
- State Funding \$32 million
 - State Basic
 - State Public Assistance
 - State Performance

Adult Education Funding

- Approximately \$50 million in funding distributed to programs
- Results in about \$470 per student
 - FY2011 figures

Numbers Served in Adult Education

In FY2011 – Served Approximately 106,000 students with approximately

- English as a Second Language -55%
- Adult Basic Education 23%
- Adult Secondary Education 17%

Adult Education Statistics

- Almost I.8 million Illinois residents have less than I2 grades of formal education
- More than 2.61 million Illinois residents speak a language other than English
- 639,000 immigrants currently reside in Illinois.
- Some Adult Education programs have wait lists
- Some are entering programs to advance in jobs, enter postsecondary and the workforce

 Need to provide instructional offerings that meet with industry needs.

 Need to better prepare students to enter postsecondary education.

Illinois Statistics

- 22% of those in Adult Education with a goal of postsecondary education and training actually transition.
- 62% of adults without a high school diploma currently participate in the workforce
- Of Illinois' 8 million adults in Illinois over the age of 18, 44% have not completed any college coursework.
